The **Housing Rights Project** advances housing justice for low-income homeowners, tenants, and tenant groups by preventing foreclosures and evictions; increasing and preserving the supply of decent affordable housing; improving existing housing conditions, including physical conditions and management practices; and by expanding and enforcing low income tenants' rights. We are proud partners with United Way of Broward County, the Mission United Project, Broward Partnership for the Homeless, and Family Success Centers.

For low-income tenants, we evaluate:

- Eviction defense
- Tenant requests for repairs
- · Illegal lockout or shut-off of utilities by landlords
- · Tenants renting properties in foreclosure or where landlord has not paid association fees
- · Wrongful withholding of security deposits
- Public housing and Section 8 eligibility / defense
- · Veteran or PLWHA facing a housing issue
